



Pennine Fell Runners and Your Personal Data

Background.

The General Data Protection Regulation (usually referred to as GDPR) reinforces the 1998 Data Protection Act and was adopted on April 27, 2016. After a two year transition period, it will become legally enforceable from May 25, 2018.

It's aim is to give back control over their data to the people that data identifies.

This policy explains how Pennine Fell Runners uses the personal data which you provide. The aim, while using and processing your data, is always to be respectful of your privacy and to comply with both the Data Protection Act and GDPR.

Your data.

Pennine Fell Runners needs the following personal data from you:-

- a) Your name and postal address;
- b) Your phone numbers (mobile and landline);
- c) Your email address;
- d) The name and phone number of a person who may be contacted on your behalf in the case of an emergency;
- e) Your date of birth.

Why Pennine Fell Runners needs your data, and how that data is used.

Your information is needed so that we can contact you to provide you with information regarding club events, to assist with running those events and reporting on them, for example we produce the club championship and handicap lists, and for necessary information in emergencies.

Legislation requires that there is a clear legal basis for processing personal information. Pennine Fell Runners relies on the individual's consent in order to process their data.

The information is processed and stored on certain club members' computers and on a commercially provided server.

The commercially-provided server is GDPR-compliant, and members who have been provided with your data have been informed that the data is only to be used for Pennine Fell Runner's purposes, and they have also been informed how to care for your data, and what reasonable precautions they should take to prevent loss of that data.

Specifically we produce:-

- a) Group email addresses for contacting the club and specific groups within the club (email address);
- b) Club Championship results for the current year (name and age category);
- c) Club handicap listings (name);
- d) Results for club-based races and events (name and age category);
- e) Emergency contact data for Club event organisers (name, mobile and emergency contact).

Note that results may be published on the club website, or emailed to club members.

Does Pennine Fell Runners share this information externally?

We do not share any information with any external bodies except in the instance where a member requires affiliation to England Athletics. Some members ask us to do this so that they can take part in athletics disciplines other than fell running.

[Note: Affiliation to English Athletics is not required for participation in a fell race, but you must be a member of the FRA in order to compete for Pennine Fell Runners as part of a team in any national fell running championships, including the British Athletics Fell Relay.]

We will share your personal data in order to comply with any legal obligations which may occur - for instance, in an enquiry following an accident at a fell running event.

Other than these rare exclusions, we will not in any way give your personal details to any external body without your express permission.

What else do you need to know?

Pennine Fell Runners only needs your information while you are a member of the club. When you resign, we will delete your information once it is no longer necessary for current club functions (current year's handicaps, championships etc). If you are registered with England Athletics, we will inform England Athletics that you are no longer a club member, in accordance with their processes.

But this is about your data - you will always be able to ask to see what personal data Pennine Fell Runners holds on your behalf, and you will be able request changes and deletions as you think necessary.
